ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

Through both single grade level and multiage environments, our elementary schools use a balanced approach to literacy and math to develop positive academic mindsets and habits of success, inspiring lifelong learning in students. We encourage students to be curious about the world in which they live as they experience a wide-range of exploratory opportunities in art, music, physical education, science and information media and technology. Our elementary students develop abilities to persevere through challenges, build respectful relationships and reflect on their strengths and interests as the foundation for our comprehensive K-12 school counseling program.

MIDDLE SCHOOLS

ISD 192 middle schools use a block schedule to provide time for deep, project-based learning, fewer transition times for students, and more flexibility for teachers to provide in-class supports. Additionally, students may progress through accelerated coursework in math and language arts and are provided a myriad of exploratory opportunities driven by student choice; some of which, like extensive fine arts programming, are created using student input. Our middle schools feature a unique daily, multiage advisory program designed to provide students with a multi-year connection to a single adult, intentional community building, and positive mentoring and leadership from older students.

FARMINGTON HIGH SCHOOL

FHS offers comprehensive, challenging, and personalized learning programming through the purposeful integration of technology. Students explore multiple academic pathways through coursework that matches instruction with student readiness, and learning opportunities with student's strengths. Through advanced learning pathways, post-secondary planning opportunities, partnerships with local colleges and flexibly-paced learning environments, students grow into expert learners who master challenges, manage their workflow and advocate for themselves.
