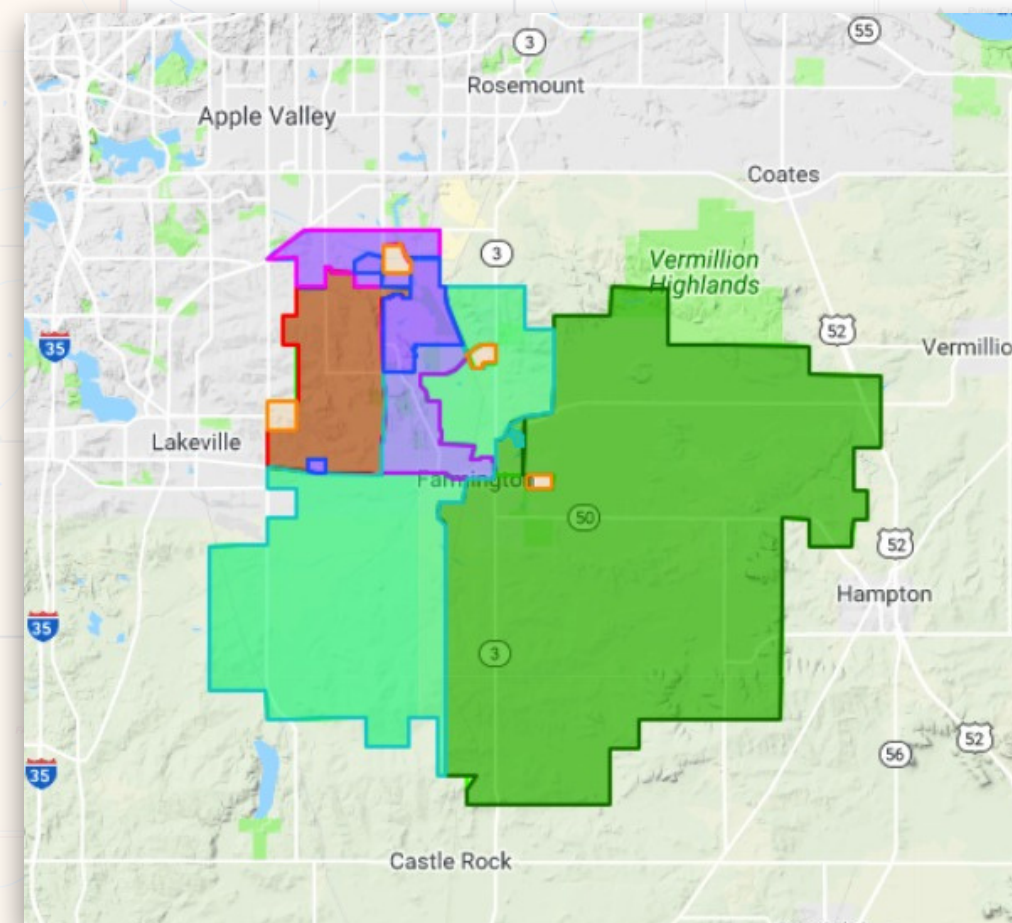

# MEADOWVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Meadowview Elementary School is an energetic learning environment that ignites creative, critical and collaborative thinking. Students participate in information and technology literacy, music, art, and physical education classes which focus on hands-on learning. Leadership and collaboration opportunities include School Patrol, Student Council, the Science Fair, and student-led videotaped announcements each day. Students may also participate in mentoring partnerships across grades. The heart of Meadowview is strong relationships and a supportive community.





# NORTH TRAIL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

North Trail Elementary provides learning opportunities all year long, partnering with families and the community in the educational journey. At North Trail, students develop a strong literacy base that enhances all learning experiences. Lifelong learning and healthy choices are reinforced with daily Physical Education for all students. During the summer students have access to the school library, educational field trips, and the STAR program which continues exposure to new learning and reading opportunities.





# RIVERVIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Riverview Elementary School offers students a supportive community focused on kindness, global citizenship and personalized learning. Students explore the surrounding countryside through outdoor learning activities led by an iNature Specialist. Music, art, physical education, and information technology and literacy classes are a part of the weekly schedule. Students may also opt to participate in the annual science fair, global citizenship fair, school patrol and other activities. Riverview also offers multiage classrooms.





# ROBERT BOECKMAN MIDDLE SCHOOL

Boeckman Middle School is a nurturing community of independent, innovative learners. It offers students the opportunity to own their learning, to be information problem solvers and reflective learners, through projects, real-world experiences, authentic audience feedback and interdisciplinary instruction. What I Need Time (WIN Time) and Interstellar Time allow students to explore how they learn, assess their own needs and make informed choices about their learning, such as where they work and how they use their time.
