2022-23 Key Dates – ACCESS for ML

ACCESS for ML or Alternate ACCESS for ML

- 12/12/22 Initial Number of ML students by grade due (for processing materials)
- 1/20/23 Initial materials received at district this week and distributed to schools.
- 1/20/23 to 3/17/23 Additional materials ordering window
- 1/30/23 to 3/24/23 Testing Window
- Before tests are administered
 - TRAINING MUST BE COMPLETED
 - ALL GENERAL SUPPORTS AND ACCOMMODATIONS DUE

What's New for 2022-23

- Stand-alone field test for the redesigned Alternate ACCESS.
 - Initial test materials automatically sent based on 2020-21 participation (21-22??)
 - New required training module added
- Any devices used for translation must be documented in Test Administration Report (TAR)
- Must confirm at district level "ensuring students receive the supports or accommodations that they require during testing"

- If missed initially, Paper Materials can be ordered from 1/20/23 thru 3/17/23 – please allow at least one week for delivery
- NOTE: Reach out to your student's SpEd Staff early and often to ensure students get the accommodations and support that they need

2022-23 Key Dates – MCA/MTAS

MCA/MTAS - All public school students participate (including Multilingual Learners) in:

- 1/20/23 Initial deadline for identifying MTAS testers or MCA testers needing paper materials
- 2/28/23 to 5/1/23 Additional materials ordering window (5/8/21 is final day for Science)
- 3/6/23 to 5/5/23 Testing Window (5/12 is final day for Science only)

All general supports, linguistic supports and accommodations due before tests are administered

MCA/MTAS Accommodations, Supports and Multilingual Learner Considerations

- <u>General supports</u> are features or practices available for all students that tailor the testing experience based on student needs or preferences. General supports include online tools and accessibility features available in online assessments and general test-taking practices.
- <u>Linguistic supports</u> are available in MCA/MTAS for students who are identified as English learners in MARSS.
- <u>Accommodations</u> are changes in the way that a test is administered which reduce or eliminate the effects of a disability. <u>Accommodations are only available to students</u> with an **IEP or 504 plan**, and all needed accommodations are documented annually in the IEP prior to testing.
