MAP Reporting 101 – Quick Start Guide

Simplifying NWEA MAP Growth – First steps towards informing instruction, personalizing learning and monitoring individual student growth.

How do I access MAP Data for my students?

All Staff can run reports for their classes and students with a standard browser (Chrome, Safari...).

- o edSpring Access Instructions / One-Click Reports
- o <u>NWEA</u> − Access Instructions / VIEW REPORTS → MAP Growth Reports

Where should I start?

Run the desired reports listed below and follow-up using the associated prompts. Start with the subject (1-4 below) that will provide the most value and move on to other areas as they are needed.

1. Classroom at a Glance – Where are my kids today?

NWEA MAP Current Year End Growth

- Verify you have results for your whole class (RIT levels and Growth targets...)
- Use One-Click Report Widgets within report to investigate more thoroughly leveraging:
 - o RIT or Achievement Level sorts and filters
 - o Result summaries by group, histograms, and proficiency/growth percentages

Achievement Status and Growth Summary with Quadrant Chart

- Group students by growth achievement
- Use results to answer questions like:
 - Are the results expected? Are they consistent with what other evidence?
 - o Are interventions/challenge activities in place where needed? Are existing efforts working?
- 2. Instructional Planning How do I leverage MAP data to personalize learning?

Class Breakdown Report

- See RIT level ranges and goals by sub-category for entire class in one grid
- Click on a goal area, RIT range or individual student to access Learning Continuum to see the skills or concepts students are ready to learn and incorporate into your instructional plans
- Drill into sub-goal areas to determine if NWEA RIT results fall in line with expected student results
- **3. Individual Growth** How do I promote individual student growth and achievement?

<u>Student Profile Report</u> & <u>Test History Summary</u>

- Are there any warning signs that data may not accurately reflect student learning?
- Is duration of test appropriate and/or were there disengaged responses?
- Examine results in context of other assessments and benchmarks and adjust instruction accordingly
