Farmington Community Education reserves the right to cancel any activity due to insufficient enrollment. Every effort will be made to contact registrants 48 hours before the scheduled start of the activity. A full refund will be issued.

Persons withdrawing from a class or activity more than 5 business days prior to the start of a class or activity can receive a refund minus a \$5 processing fee OR transfer to a different class or activity in the same brochure, or receive a credit for use for a similar program by June 30.

If you need to cancel your registration, please call us as soon as possible to request a refund. We can be reached at (651) 460-3200, M-F from 7:30 am - 4:30 pm.

If you cancel your registration less than 5 business days prior to the start of the class or activity there will be no refund.

Farmington Community Education periodically takes pictures of participants in our classes and during other sponsored activities. These photos may be used in the Community Education catalog or other promotional materials. If you do not wish to have your picture taken or published you must provide us written notice in advance.

If District 192 schools are closed for the day, all daytime and after school Community Education activities are canceled. A decision about Community Education evening activities will be made by mid-afternoon. Please call the weather hotline at 651-460-3299.

Farmington Community Education Youth Programs CODES OF CONDUCT AND WAIVERS

MANDATORY & ENFORCEABLE CODES OF CONDUCT FOR PARTICIPANTS, PARENTS AND SUPPORTERS

Waiver: I hereby represent that I/my child is in good health and may participate and compete in rigorous physical activity and authorize the Independent School District 192 to secure any medical emergency treatment deemed necessary and waive and release ISD 192 and employees from any liability for injuries or damages sustained by me/my student at the designated activity.

Parent / Guardian Medical Emergency Authorization - In the event of a medical emergency while my child is participating in the program, I authorize the adult in charge of the program or designee to release the medical information provided by me to the healthcare provider, and to arrange for treatment in an emergency. I understand that Community Education officials will use the contact information provided to try to contact me in the event of such emergency. I agree to be financially responsible for the costs of any such medical procedures or treatment. I understand that Community Education/ISD 192 does not provide medical/health insurance for me/ my student.

Expectations- I understand that I/my student will follow instructions given by the adult in charge of the program and will comply with all rules for student conduct for the Community Education program. Negative attitudes, behavior, and disrespect to instructors/coaches or peers will not be tolerated. If this occurs, disciplinary action will be taken, including possible dismissal from the program.

Informed Consent- By its nature, participation in this program's activities includes risk of injury and the transmission of infectious diseases such as Human immunodeficiency virus (HIV), Herpes, Hepatitis B and others. Although serious injuries are not common and the risk of HIV transmission is almost nonexistent in supervised Community Education programs, it is impossible to eliminate all risk. Participants have the responsibility to reduce that risk. Participants must obey all safety rules, report physical and hygiene problems, and report any concerns about the equipment.

PARENTS, GUARDIANS WHO MAY NOT WISH TO ACCEPT THE RISK DESCRIBED IN THIS WARNING SHOULD NOT SIGN THE FORM. STUDENTS MAY NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE COMMUNITY EDUCATION PROGRAM WITHOUT THE PARENT'S / GUARDIAN'S SIGNATURE.

Recognize all volunteers who are giving up their valuable time.
Never publicly criticize participants or coaches – raise personal concerns with program supervisors in private.
Don't use negative remarks based on race, religion, gender or ability. Discrimination will not be tolerated.
Drugs, alcohol and tobacco are not allowed on ISD 192 buildings and grounds at any time.
